MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

PRESENT

- 311/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to receive apologies for absence from PCSO Jim Newns, Councillors M Bhatia, R Chamberlain, D Fosbrook, B Horan, K Stepien-Bialy, T Priestman and T Whiskard.
- 312/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to receive dispensations and declarations of interest from Cllr Barber who declared an interest in items related to the Lyme Green Hall (as a Member of the management committee for St. James Church Hall).
- 313/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to confirm and sign the Minutes as a true record of the Meetings held on 14th November 2024.
- 314/24 **Public Participation - THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to receive information/queries/questions from members of the public (MOPs): (10 minutes) There were no MOPs present.

- 315/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to receive report from the Cheshire East Ward Member.

- 317/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to receive report from the Lyme Green Community Hall working group. Members were concerned that the working group have taken certain steps which have overstepped their terms of reference. These include appointing a solicitor and not referring the fee arrangement to the Parish Council for agreement and taking matters forward that have not been agreed by the Parish Council. The working group has no power to make decisions on behalf of the Council and has not made recommendations to the Council for them to agree in a timely way and before action being taken. While the group have done well to take the project this far **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to agree that it is time to bring this matter under the control of the Parish Council and disband the working group. In this way all councillors can properly monitor the decision-making process ensuring there is always agreement by the full council and funds are correctly used.
- THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to agree to write to the Working Group disbanding the group and informing the solicitor to make sure he puts all works on hold.
- a) **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to discuss and **did not agree at this stage** with recommendations, by the solicitor, for the format of the Charitable Trust and preparation of papers for submission to the Charitable Trust.
- b) **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to discuss and **did not agree at this stage** to nominate an individual to attend meetings or alternatively, nominate two individuals to serve as Trustees in their own right and it was felt they would want to seek further advise of corporate trustees.
- c) **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to discuss and **did not agree at this stage** to the wording of the constitution.

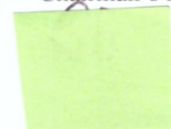

319/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to **approve** bank reconciliation up to 30th November 2024 and to **verify** figures against bank statements.

320/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to **agree** budget for 2025/26 (*Deadline - Friday, 17th January 2025*) and set the precept at **£29500 (TWENTYNINE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS)** and establish another line for traffic calming and road safety under projects £500 (donation from Cadent once received).

MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE COUNCIL

321/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to **consider** commenting on notice of polling district, polling places and polling stations review and **agree** no response needed. (*Deadline 18th December 2024*)

322/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to **agree** meeting dates for 2025.

323/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to **agree** to write to Cheshire East Council raising concerns that the “Three Villages CIC group” have, enquiring regarding what measures are in place across the County with respect to eradicating Himalayan balsam, why it not on their list of non-native invasive plants and ask for reassurance that something is being done. Also, to write to the Canal and River Trust also raising these concerns and whether they have a policy regarding Himalayan balsam.

PLAYGROUNDS

324/24 **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to **receive** a report from Park 4all @ Lyme Green and **agree** the following:

- Members **agreed** that, while properties are still being built at Gaw End Lane, monies cannot be freed up until there is greater occupancy and therefore Members **did not agree** to liaise with Park 4all (with a view to writing to the Chief Executive of CEC) regarding the delay in utilising the S106 monies to 2028/29 however, the Council did **agree** that they will ask the Ward Council for clarity on this matter.
- Members **did not agree** that a donation of £396 towards a notice board at Lyme Green Community Park as it is not a priority for the Parish Council at this time. A review of notice boards was undertaken



recently and the Parish Council committed to a notice board at Higher Sutton and Lyme Green allotments. If the Parish Council were to commit monies to a notice board it would be to the Gaw End Lane estate and would be in a similar style to those on the allotments and in the Rural Ward.

325/24 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to discuss and agree that they were happy with the surface recommended by the Parks Technical Officer for Langley Playing Field and look forward to hearing from the Officer regarding community consultation early next year.

ALLOTMENTS

326/24 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to discuss and agree splitting plots 10/11A into three separate plots.

HIGHWAYS MATTERS

327/24 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to discuss road closure for advance works on Langley Road (6th March to 21st March) and **agree** to write to Highways expressing concerns over the proposed diversion route which, is unacceptable, using unsuitable lanes and request they re-consider and look at a traffic light system instead. Points to raise: 1. have they consulted with local business, bus company and thought of the impact (wagons cannot go down Standing Stone Lane) 2. have they considered the considerable impact on residents 3. Have they considered the weight limits on the lanes they have diverted to.

328/24 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to receive reports on highways issues and consider the following action:

- Potholes outside the Old School on Main Road Langley (5 pot holes dinner plate size).
- Road surface eroded and hazardous to cyclists and vehicles on the corner of Radcliff Road and Old Leek Road (where the junction is for Hawkhead Quarry).

THE GRAPEVINE

329/24 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to discuss ideas for inclusion in the next Grapevine magazine:

- focus on climate matters e.g. LED Christmas bulbs – how much has been saved.
- saving the planet – promoting green issues where we can – e.g. changing lamp posts to LED bulbs.

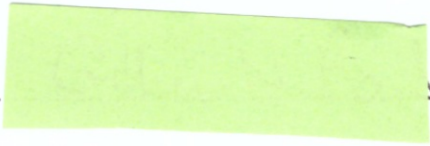
