The Ward Councillor attended the Park 4all Christmas event in Lyme Green and spoke with the trustees of the charity regarding funding.

- Goran Lane to speak with Cheshire East regarding cars still parked at the end of the lane.
- 6/20 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to receive report from Macclesfield Neighbourhood Policing Team (PCSO Jim Newns)
 - Leaflets will be distributed around the area including details of the Community Support Officer.
 - Reported that there is now a dedicated rural policing team.
 - Reported that his area includes Macclesfield East and Sutton.
 - Reported that a number of PCSOs have been recruited as police officers and they are trying to recruit more PCSOs with one for Sutton.
 - He is concentrating on schools including parking and attending assemblies.
 - Police surgeries are based at Teggs Nose but, it is proposed to have surgeries every other week in the Ex-Servicemen's Club Sutton.
 - Reported that he has been out with a speed gun.


