- 104/23 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to agree election of Cllr Barber as Chairman for 2023/2024 and receive Chairman's acceptance of office. Cllr Barber was proposed by Cllr Sinclair Smith and seconded by Cllr D Fosbrook and agreed by the meeting. There were no other nominations.
- 105/23 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to agree election of Cllr Sinclair Smith as Vice Chairman 2023/2024 and receive Vice Chairman's acceptance of office. Cllr Sinclair Smith was proposed by Cllr Fosbrook and seconded by Cllr Chamberlain and agreed by the meeting. There were no other nominations.

- 120/23 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to receive report from graveyard working group:

 Planning consent received with conditions and the group will be convening a meeting to discuss next stage.

HIGHWAYS MATTERS

121/23 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to receive reports on highways issues and agree the following actions:

- Requested that the whole of Bollinhead Lane up to where it joins Wetton Way be reported as in bad condition
- Bridge over river at bottom of Church Lane just past junction of Judy Lane wall is crumbling and bowed to such extent that MOP concerned. Highways need to check parapet and whether structurally sound.
- Draw attention notice about the pedestrian crossing on London road. Comments needed by 25th May.
- a. Members agree that there needs to be a crossing however, they would like to see a widening of the footpath on the East side to create protected parking buys and create a pedestrian puffin crossing. This would make the road a lot safer.
- b. Members would request that the monitoring of the speed limit to 30 mph should be looked at again because, of concerns for children crossing the road due to lack of footpath on the lefthand side, and the increase in traffic exiting and entering the new development.
- c. Members would ask that the Council re-consider traffic lights at the Lindrum Avenue junction.
- d. Additionally, Members would request clarity on what is proposed on London Road.

MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE COUNCIL

- 122/23 THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to consider whether to continue with membership of CVS Cheshire East (increase of membership from £50 to £100) and agreed not to continue with membership.



CORRESPONDENCE

- 137/23 Cheshire East Council Update on Local bus services April 2023. THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to agree the following response:
 - The bus returns by a different route with no bus stops e.g. the majority of the stops are on other side of the road.
 - The route restricts the residents at the Settlement, in Lyme Green, who now cannot get a bus back and preventing their independence.
 - The service is every 2 hrs with the bus going down Byrons Lane providing no service to residents. Thus, the new service seems to be a way of promoting travel by car and in the long run ensuring a cut of service to the community.
 - The connectivity between the three villages has been further restricted.
 - There is no services for the new housing at Lyme Green.
 - The service has been reduced/changed to such an extent that it has created a route that is unusable for our residents and particularly the most vulnerable in our community.

Members also discussed that residents could write to the Council with their stories about how the changing bus service affects them.

- 138/23 MOP Resident has concerns regarding hedge cutting on Cock Hall Lane. Members understood this was not the responsibility of Cheshire East and the farmer had actioned. It is understood that hedges are not cut between April to August unless necessary for safety. THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to refer resident to the Nature Conservation Officer at Cheshire East Council.
- 139/23 Cheshire East Council parking problems at junction between Byrons Lane and Bullocks Lane. THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to refer this matter to the Ward Councillor.
- 140/23 Cheshire East Council Lyme Green Settlement enquiry regarding possible breach of planning permission at the Lyme Green Settlement. **THE COUNCIL RESOLVED** to refer this matter to the Ward Councillor.
- 141/23 MOP concerns regarding party politics and the Parish Council. Members discussed concerns and THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to note.
- 142/23 MOP objection to application 23/1269M. THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to note however the Council had already commented on application, but they would keep an eye on footpath.
- 143/23 MOP enquiry regarding refurbishment of signs Robin Crescent. THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to review the issue.
- 144/23 MOP Leek Old Road, Macclesfield regarding surface water. THE COUNCIL RESOLVED to note correspondence.

Appendix 1 - Ward Councillors report

- Cheshire East is now run as a Labour/Independent coalition.
- There are some issues with budget In February there were some big cuts agreed and areas of income
 growth. This includes looking at car parking charges and green bin tax. There are some concerns about
 increase in parking in town centre and the green bin tax takes no account of increase in fly tipping and the
 use of other bins.
- Save Dans Moss planning will be going through in next couple of months. The Parish Council will get to speak at the Planning Board for 5 minutes and he would encourage Members to do this.
- Gaw End Lane it is a challenge to find out what is going to happen on London Road. He has spoken with Lyme Green Councillors regarding the issues and businesses.
- Reported 70 odd potholes in a two week period.
- Winter gritting routes will be reviewed in June.
- Going forward the Ward Councillor has a budget which has to be used on highways. He will divide between
 the Wards. £1000 has to be spent on signage, painting white lines etc and he would ask that this be put to
 Members at the next Council meeting.
- Members were asked to keep him informed of any issues.

Appendix 2 - Climate Emergency Working Group

- Earth Day took place. A lot of work went into the day and there was a lot of creative activity involved. The lack of people attending was disappointing however, the group will reflect on lessons to be learnt.
- Community Orchard it looks like this cannot be moved forward at this stage. It is understood that the land is being cleared for tenants. Cheshire East have expressed surprise that there are tenants appointed to land and will be making enquiries regarding the type of tenancy.
- They will be setting a date for the next meeting and have the support of the full support of Council.
